Working in partnership to reduce inequalities in our communities

What is the budget of the AP?

The Area Partnership can allocate:

£50,000 on general projects in the area



£50,000 of the Roads department budget for the area.



£100,000 (*time equivalent*) of the Amenity Services budget for the area



£100,000 for projects to raise educational attainment

Total devolved budget for each AP 2018/19= £300,000

(*Musselburgh £350k) with potential to lever in additional external funding
