Guidance for dog walking businesses during Covid-19 pandemic

Think very carefully about going out to work at all especially if you, a family member or one of your clients may fall into a vulnerable category. Everyone's health is a priority.

Consider restricting services to key workers only. It is recommended these clients confirm to you in writing that, as a key worker, they have no alternative to ensure the welfare needs of the animal are met.

If you do continue to operate:

- Avoid direct contact with clients during dog collection and drop off. You could collect a dog from the garden or from a separate room
- Use personal protective equipment and change regularly (eg shoe covers, disposable gloves, hand sanitiser)
- Use your own lead for each dog and disinfect between use
- Walk dogs from the client's home to minimise risk of contamination from/to your vehicle or home. If you must transport dogs ensure to disinfect crates in between pickups
- Walk on your own and follow social distancing guidance no group walking
- Keep dogs on leads and shorten walks
- Check with your insurances (business and vehicle) that there are no clauses that may leave you uncovered during these times
