Yes, East Lothian Council (ELC) has long been in the process of installing energy efficient lighting. Even traditional Orange Low Pressure Sodium lamp were efficient when installed and are still considered efficient enough, from a lumen per watt point of view. ELC expects to have substantially completed its switch to LED or other modern White light sources in 4 years' time, subject to available funding and competing priorities.

# 3. How much did the council spend on running, installing and maintaining street lighting under the council's jurisdiction in 2015, 2016 and 2017?

Budgets for Energy (running), Capital (installing) and Revenue (maintaining) were as follows, expressed in tens of thousands:
