For this survey all samples were taken by janitorial staff at the schools in question following an instruction to take the samples first thing in the morning (first draw/stagnation) before the schools opened. They used 1 litre plastic bottles suitable for chemical sampling of water. They were then returned to Environmental Health who delivered them to the Public Analyst lab in Edinburgh for analysis.
