East Lothian Council (ELC) directly operates and manages 4 museums and supports a further two community museums and one volunteer run exhibition space.

2) How many items are there in your museums' collections? What is their combined value?

There are 16,422 items in the museum collection.

We only have a value for the artworks in the collection. We don't have a current valuation for any other part of the collection. In view of this, under Section 17(1)(b) of the Act, I must formally advise you that ELC has been unable to comply with this part of your request as the information you require is not held.
