All retailers are required to hold an explosives licence, granted by East Lothian Council, should they wish to store fireworks for sale. There is also a prohibition on the use of fireworks during the Night Hours – people must apply for dispensation from the Council, if they wish to have a display after 11pm.

The applicable legislation includes:

Explosives Regulations 2014 Pyrotechnic Articles (Safety) Regulations 2015 Fireworks Regulations 2004 Fireworks (Scotland) Regulations 2004

3. Who within the local authority is responsible for enforcing this?

Licensing for the licensing aspect and Trading Standards for safety checks on storage facilities and fireworks. Environmental Health for dispensation and consideration of potential nuisance.

2. If yes, what restrictions are in place?

Council Policy prohibiting balloon and lantern releases on Council owned land and property; and at events licensed, endorsed or supported by the Council, including those on non-Council land.

The Council as Licensing Authority attaches a condition to all Public Entertainment Licences prohibiting the release of balloons or lanterns at any event covered by said licences.
