What is a Community Council?

- Established by the Wheatley Commission (1973)
- Statutory obligation upon Local Authorities to put in place local schemes and review
- CCs are statutory consultees for Planning and Licensing applications
- Purpose (as per 1973 Local Govt (Scot) Act)

"the general purpose of a CC shall be to ascertain, coordinate and express to the local authority and other public authorities, the views of the community which it represents...."

- Preserved/endorsed by 1994 Local Govt Act
- Empowered to act to further the interests of their communities within bounds of constitution
- Actively seek views & opinions of full cross section of the communities they serve
- Non-party political

What does it mean to be a Community Councillor?

- Roles set out in the Scottish Government's -<u>GOOD PRACTICE</u> <u>GUIDANCE (www.gov.scot)</u> - (under review)
- Represent the views of your community, not just your own
- Agreeing local priorities and allocating funding
- Encourage people to raise issues of concern to take to the Community Council
- Attend regular meetings and training sessions provided
- Ethical standards in public life and Code of Conduct
- Elect office bearers Chair, Secretary, Treasurer. Also agree the Area Partnership rep's and resilience SPOC/depute.
- Some CCs also have a Planning lead
- Improvement Service dedicated community council website <u>Community Council (communitycouncils.scot)</u>
- Handbook for Community Councillors being finalised

Community Councils in East Lothian

- Scheme for Community Councils, known locally as the 'Green Book', sets out how CCs should operate
- 20 Community Councils, covering all of East Lothian <u>Community</u> <u>Councils | East Lothian Council</u>

(Click on the link to the Community Council and this will take you to their details)

- Significant variations in size/demography
- Term of Office 4 years vacancies & powers to co-opt
- Minimum age of 16 to participate
- Must adopt a constitution and submit a copy to ELC via <u>communitycouncils@eastlothian.gov.uk</u>
- Must maintain proper accounts audited, then submitted to ELC
 Audit Team reviews accounts.
- Association of East Lothian Community Councils meetings provide an opportunity for CC Chairs/reps to meet with ELC officers for updates and to discuss topics of interest. (New Chair tbc)

Some East Lothian facts and figures....

- Population just over **107,000** & increasing
- Under 16s = 18%, working age = 62% and pensionable age = 20%
- 22 elected member seats on East Lothian Council 8 Lab*, 6 SNP, 7
 Cons across the 6 multi-member wards
 - 1 Musselburgh (4)
 - 2 Preston Seton Gosford (4*)
 - 3 Tranent, Wallyford & Macmerry (4)
 - 4 North Berwick Coastal (3)
 - 5 Haddington & Lammermuir (4)
 - 6 Dunbar & East Linton (3)

(*By-election to be held in January for Preston Seton Gosford ward following recent death of Cllr Willie Innes)

Community Councils in East Lothian

- Conduct business/activities in a transparent & accessible way
- Regular meetings often monthly but minimum every 3 months
- Due to COVID risks CCs are recommended to meet virtually, via zoom. Usually Council premises available for meetings (or hire costs reimbursed)
- Local resilience teams and designated Single Point of Contact (SPOCs) – ELC's Emergency Planning team provide guidance to develop local resilience plan
- Key contact at ELC for other matters is the local Connected Communities Manager
- Each Area Partnership has Community Council representation as core voting members, to help identify priorities for the Area Plan and agree funding requests to address inequalities.

Funding

ELC provides each Community Council with an annual grant comprising:

- Administration Grants to cover basic admin costs. Some CCs make a one-off annual payment to the secretary
- Local Priorities Scheme annual grant to CCs to make payments to local groups etc, to address their local priorities

Examples include donations to galas, playgroups, guides/scouts, benches, Xmas lights.....

- Speak to relevant Council officers for advice or elected member
- Public Liability Insurance ELC covers cost of policy for CCs.
- External Funding Opportunities information about various sources of funding......
