Hargreaves Land - Blindwells

Hargreaves Land are continuing to make significant progress in the delivery of the sustainable New Town at Blindwells.

There are now 119 homes occupied on site, comprising a mix of Cruden, Bellway and Persimmon houses. Ogilvie Homes are also making good progress and have now got their first plots up for sale.



Hargreaves Land are currently working on the design of two new play areas for the first phase of homes at the Blindwells development. Planning applications for these play areas will be submitted soon and they will be ready for use later this year.









Working with P1 Contractors, we have recently planted 19,000 trees at Blindwells as part of an initial phase of work to create eye-catching natural landscape which will be enjoyed by local people and visitors for decades to come.

Species have been carefully selected for their

relevance to the surrounding area and will be predominantly native with a small number of ornamental trees.



The initiative is part of a masterplan to deliver a robust, beautifully natural-looking site-wide infrastructure, focused around biodiversity and wellbeing – woodland belts, screen planting, tree lined avenues and wildflower meadows create a robust, green network of spaces and the perfect backdrop for development plots to nestle into.

Longniddry Community Council members are volunteers who care about their community and want to make it a better place to live. We represent Longniddry, Seton Mains and currently the new residents at Blindwells. In December we organized the switch-on of the Longniddry Christmas lights, followed by a reception in the beautifully-decorated Community Centre enjoyed by around 160 villagers. Although this was a free event, donations received enabled us to contribute £80 to Longniddry Church and £80 to the Community Centre for their work to help people in financial difficulties this winter. Now that the restrictions of COVID are over, we have representatives of the Gala Committee and Longniddry Church coming along to our meetings with the aim to work together to support and grow our village events. We are delighted to have welcomed a new resident from the Longniddry South development to join us, and we'd love to welcome more residents to get involved. We will be supporting the Communities Day on 29th April at the Community Centre to promote all the activities and groups our village has to offer.

The Community Council is often contacted with concerns about traffic issues. In particular parking on the double yellow lines outside the Co-op on Links Rd and the Village Shop near the station. The parking restrictions are there to make these crossing points safer for us all and we urge everyone to respect them.

Electric scooters have also brought complaints and we remind everyone that the police will confiscate any which are seen being used on our roads and pavements illegally.

Finally, on a positive note we have been very pleased that the resurfacing of Kings Avenue has now been completed by ELC after much lobbying about the recurring potholes.



Longniddry Open Gardens

I am grateful for the opportunity through the Longniddry Newsletter to promote Scotland's Gardens Scheme (SGS). As many readers may know already, villages, towns and individuals throughout Scotland open their gardens every year for a small entry fee. Information about such openings is available in the "Yellow Book" or on the SGS website (scotlandsgardens.org).

The SGS has been in existence since 1931, the aim "to raise money for charity by encouraging, promoting and supporting garden openings, whilst making the whole experience inspiring, rewarding and enjoyable for all involved."

This has been a very successful venture for Longniddry Open Gardens. I helped organise the event in 2017 and again in 2021 (delayed a year because of Covid) where nearly £3000 was raised both times for a number of charities in just one sunny Sunday afternoon. The next planned open date is **Sunday June 23rd, 2024 i.e. Next year!**

Gardening has taken off in recent years especially during lockdowns and its benefits in improving both physical and mental health and wellbeing has been firmly established. An Open Day is an opportunity to showcase a set of beautiful gardens, provide inspiration and further encourage gardening generally. There is time to speak personally to the gardeners and glean new ideas for visitors' own gardens. A visit to gardens can be a day of great enjoyment for all concerned and I cannot recommend it highly enough. In addition, it is great to see so many visitors come into the village and provide support for the community. The gardeners make them welcome and on previous openings we have a plant stall where locally grown plants known to thrive here can be bought and afternoon teas available when weary legs need a rest.

I have liaised with previous garden "openers" about preparing and opening their gardens again next year and think most of them will be on board, including my own. However, I am always on the lookout for

"new" gardens where owners are willing to open. I would be delighted for interested gardeners to become involved. I am happy to provide as much information that potential gardeners may require. I know next summer seems a long way off but getting a garden going with an opening in mind can take a wee bit of planning!

East Lothian has become the first area in Scotland to deploy an innovative platform designed to invigorate and stimulate the county's local economy through a web site and downloadable mobile app, described as a 'single point of discovery' for all that East Lothian offers. In just over six months, 3000 local people have downloaded the free app and hundreds of businesses have added themselves to it.

SOLE – Supporting Our Local Economy is a community platform created by the Scottish Tech Army (STA) that is supported by the UK Government's UK Community Renewal Fund and East Lothian Council and will inject further impetus to help East Lothian's post pandemic business recovery.

Available as a downloadable mobile app or via a web-enabled platform, SOLE is designed to empower all East Lothian residents to 'think, act and shop local'. The app has been created and designed as a single digital point of

discovery that allows people across the county to access local shops and other services such as booking activities or events, find a local service, join a group, go on a walking trail with friends, right across East Lothian.

Whether you are a business or someone who wants to make the most of the area they live in, SOLE is an incredibly powerful resource to have on your mobile device."

Fire Safety Advice

Always be careful when using alternative appliances to heat your homes, or save on your electricity bills;

- Washing Machines and Tumble Dryers should not be left on overnight
- Don't leave candles unattended; why not use LED lights or torches?
- Using gas camping stoves or gas heaters inside is not advised, as it can be a risk for fire, explosion or carbon monoxide poisoning
