The library will soon move from its current home in Wallyford Primary to the new campus. The team is excited to continue supporting the local community while still retaining close links with schools.

To prepare for the move, the current library will close at 1pm on 29 July. Initially, the new library will open to Rosehill High School pupils from the start of the school term. It will reopen to the public

after school hours from mid-Sept working toward shared access throughout the day in due course to create a shared space for pupils and wider community.

Wallyford Learning Campus has been designed as a space for community, learning, health and wellbeing.
