SUBJECT: Framework award – B&B Services

1 PURPOSE

To record the award of places on a framework agreement for Bed & Breakfast service provision.

2 RECOMMENDATIONS

Members are requested to note the decision of the Executive Director (Services for Communities) as appointed representative under Standing Order Rule 46 and delegation Appendix 2a (Tenders) thereto and after consultation with the Head of Council Resources to accept the following contractors into a framework agreement, for a period of three years, with one optional extension of one year, from 8 October 2012:

- B&B 128, Musselburgh
- Bert Logan Property (Jessmont, Dunbar; Barlae House, Haddington and Andermatt, Prestonpans)
- Brae Cottage, Tranent
- Cathy Caven, Musselburgh
- F W B&B, Musselburgh
- Mercat Hotel, Haddington
- Mrs Nish, Musselburgh
- Queen Margaret Lodge, Musselburgh
- Ravensheugh, Musselburgh
- Rooms 2 Rent, Prestonpans
- St Andrews B&B, Tranent

3 BACKGROUND

- 3.1 This was a re-tendering of an expired contract for B&B services for homeless service users.
- 3.2 Due to the nature of this contract, the opportunity was advertised in the local press on 11 May 2012 with a deadline for completed tenders of 25 June 2012.

COMPARISON OF TENDERS

- 3.3 Twelve providers submitted tenders. All passed the mandatory criteria and provided the required documentation. It was noted that several new providers submitted tenders giving more choice and coverage across the County. New providers' premises were visited and assessed as meeting the Council's requirements.
- 3.4 A different approach was taken in this tender to the previous one with regards to pricing. Rates per person per night (pppn) were sought, regardless of the size and type of room (i.e. single, double or family). It is expected that this will result in savings as the majority of service users are single people. We also specified the rate per night for children.
- 3.5 Further clarification was sought from five providers who had submitted prices which were significantly above the market rate. Some providers reduced their rate and others did not. The call offs from the framework will be at the lowest rates first (dependant on suitable location and availability).
- 3.6 Contracts were awarded to the twelve providers on 5 October 2012.
