APPENDIX

CAMERON SANGSTER ROSS

About 1300 hours on Wednesday 10th June 2015, the applicant was in the company of two other males on the High Street in Musselburgh. One of the other males had cause to speak with a group of younger males in relation to an outstanding debt of £50 owe over the sale of a guitar. One of the younger males (a 17 year old) took his wallet out of his backpack and handed £50 to this male in payment for the guitar.

The younger group then walked away towards a vennel in Kilwinning Place. They were followed by the applicant and the other unknown male. Some of the younger males noticed the applicant removing the males wallet from his backpack. By the time the younger male noticed this the applicant had moved in front of him with the wallet in his hand he began to tease the male, swiping the wallet away from his reach a number of times, the applicant stating that the male was "owe interest". The younger male was unsure at this point if the applicant was joking or not.

The applicant removed a £20 note from the wallet, which he placed in his pocket before throwing the wallet onto the ground. The younger male kneeled down to pick the wallet up and as he stood back up the applicant punched him in the face. The young male was able to stand up however found this to be very painful and felt his tooth chipping on impact. The applicant thereafter walked away from the locus.

The younger male returned to Musselburgh Grammar School where the depute head teacher contacted police on his behalf.

About 1630 hours, same date, a statement was noted by police, from the younger male at his home address. Police noted that the male had significant swelling around his right eye and that his tooth had been chipped. Statements were also noted from the younger male's three friends, all of whom named the applicant as the male responsible for the theft and assault.

About 1730 hours on Thursday 11th June 2015, officers attended at the applicants home address where he was arrested and conveyed to Dalkeith Police Station. On route the applicant proceeded to justify his actions to the officers on the grounds that the younger male had been owe money to his friend.

About 1825 hours, same date, the applicant was cautioned and charged with a theft and assault and held in custody to appear at Edinburgh Sheriff Court the following morning.

On 25th September 2015, the applicant was found guilty of Theft and Assault to Injury, sentence was deferred until 21st March 2016 when he was Admonished.
