I refer to the above application and in terms of Section 21(4)(a)(i) and (ii) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005, I have to advise you that the applicant has not been convicted of any relevant offence.

I am unable to confirm the existence of any foreign offence in respect of the applicant.

In terms of Section 22(1)(b) of the Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005:

I would seek to clarify with the applicant/agent their request for 'outdoor drinking facilities' and deliveries (which might include alcohol). Having spoken to the applicant it would appear that outdoor drinking and alcohol deliveries is not part of his business plan and therefore would request that the application be amended to reflect this.

It is also pertinent to point out that this application is out with Board Policy with regards to the overprovision statement and as such the applicant will be expected to demonstrate that the grant of this licence would outweigh the presumption against grant in terms of the overprovision statement.

PROVISIONAL PREMISES LICENCE APPLICATION – JANUARY 2017

DAL PATINO, 49A High Street, Musselburgh, East Lothian EH21 7AB

I refer to the above subject and can confirm that the above premises, formerly known as Cafe Borsa, has been visited and the applicant interviewed concerning his provisional premises licence application. I am satisfied that the Operating and Layout Plans are in accordance with the Act.

The premises will operate as a small Italian restaurant with a capacity of 35 persons. It is also proposed to provide a takeaway food service. The applicant confirms that no alcohol will be served with takeaway orders and that deliveries of food and alcohol is not part of his business plan. However, the request for off-sales facility will allow diners to takeaway any partially consumed bottles of wine.

The applicant proposes to locate 2 - 4 tables on the public foot path area outside the premises in the summertime. The area is quite suitable for this purpose, but use will be subject to gaining the necessary Tables and Chairs Permit from East Lothian Council, Transportation Division.

I can confirm that the mandatory site notice in respect of this application was correctly displayed at the time of my visit to the premises.

The application is subject to Part 4 of the Licensing Board's 'Statement of Licensing Policy 2013 – 2016' in respect of overprovision. I have however, no objections to the grant of this application.
