




### **Scottish Index of Multiple Deprivation**

- It involves, engages and consults with the community and service providers to keep the Area Plan relevant.




### How does it all work?

### **Budget Allocation**

The Area Partnership can allocate:

£50,000 on general projects in the area

£50,000 of the Roads department budget for the area.

£100,000 (time equivalent) of the Amenity
Services budget for the area

£100,000 for projects to raise educational attainment

Total for 2018-2019 = £300,000
