Priorities 2018/2019

 Gullane (Crossing at John Muir Way Luffness and speed restrictions from Luffness Corner)

Project – Replacement of Bollards & Chains at Elcho Green and The Quadrant.

- The existing bollards and chains have been in place for circa 50 years
- Over the years they have been replaced, repaired and repainted at significant cost.
- The bollards and chains have now reached the end of their life.
- Request £3,038.50



- The bollards and chains at Elcho Green provide an iconic entranceway to North Berwick.
- They are of particular significance with regards North Berwick's entry for the Beautiful Scotland In Bloom Competition in July 2018.
- There is also a wider local interest in this area coupled with the need to continue to enhance the wider visual amenity of the town.

- The specification issued for the quote was 900mm high 100mm x 100mm square posts flush capped and permanent welded rings for attachment of chains, hot dipped galvanised (Inside and out) and powder coated with white paint. The chains will be 10mm gauge 65mm link size, zinc coated and attached using quick repair links. The posts will be set 450mm into the ground in auger formed holes with no concrete so they can be easily reset if hit by vehicles and to keep cost and installation time down.
- Use of galvanised and powder coated posts with zinc coated chain should eliminate the need for painting for at least 10-15 years.
- Visually, the new bollards are as like for like as can be.

- The project is going to cost £17, 180 in total.
- Amenity Services contribution is £8, 200 (includes all "worker hours")
- NBGC contribution is £2, 903. This leaves £6, 077.
- The Community Council hopes that with the support of the Area Partnership, we can split the balance and each contribute £3, 038.50.
- This would allow NBCC to allocate the remainder of its annual Local Priority Fund from East Lothian Council to the following projects; the Christmas lights switch on as well as a contribution towards new lights, a quarterly newsletter, the refurbishment of three telephone boxes into mini museums and improvements to the emergency plan.
