4.	Matters Arising	<b>Day Centre, Dunbar</b> – The Day Centre requires volunteers to help with activities – at the moment they are very short on volunteers. 5.	Dunbar Summer School 2017	<b>Evaluation Report</b> SG had received a draft copy of the report. PS and SG would like a few amendments before this is circulated. The report is very positive with very worthy comments from both parents and school. There are lessons to be learned but overall the summer school was well received. It is hoped to continue the good work that had been started.				
6.	Education Funding Panel	<b>Recommendations</b> The group met on 3 <sup>rd</sup> August where they invited each project to discuss their application. There had been good discussion afterwards about the different projects and about how to distribute the money.				
		Dunbar Summer School- £30K would be put aside for this project. Support from the start for a Family Worker – would receive £41K. Dunbar Grammar School for Literacy Project – would receive £3,977 Dunbar Access to Activities scheme – There is £15K put aside for this project which is to help children from the Dunbar and East Linton Area Partnership to access an activity that they may not be able too through family circumstances. This is still being looked at, as to how this will be serviced and children able to access the funds.				
		<b>Dunbar Fashion School</b> – The Area Partnership decided that no further funds from the Education Budget would be allocated to any other projects at this stage so no further action was taken with this project. This position may be reviewed by the Area Partnership in due course.

7.	Project Updates	a. Dunbar Town Centre There are items still outstanding on this project. SG has been in touch with the Road Team and is waiting on their reply. There was a discussion around the St Anne Church area where the pavements are high and wondered if the kerb could be lowered. SG had contact the Roads department and see if this would be possible. There is still work to be completed throughout the Dunbar Town Centre some by ELC and some more challenging such as the painting of the buildings.	SG
0	Funding	<ul> <li>b. Coastal pathway</li> <li>GR gave an update on this project. It is hoped to resurface the cliff top path. There had been a trial on 10 metre finished with tarmac which has worked well. GR has applied to Viridor for funding to complete the rest of the pathway. SG and Neil Clark, ELC, Countryside Officer are looking into this. There has been 3 companies approached for costs, there has been two returns ranging from £51K and 60K. There was a discussion around who should be up keeping the path although the path belongs to ELC there was not funding to upgrade. GR asked if the Area Partnership would supply the £6,084third party contributions to release the funding. It was agreed that the Area Partnership would supply this funding when the money is due for release.</li> </ul>	GR
8.	Funding Proposals	<ul> <li>For consideration <ul> <li>Roads projects</li> <li>There was a discussion around project which could be completed within this financial year. The ELC Roads Team advised that they could undertake works on the Westgate at a cost of £13K, and also in the Shore and Harbour area at a cost of £42K. It was proposed to ask the Roads Team also be asked to drop the kerb outside St Anne's Church on the Westgate to facilitate mobility access. All remaining budget to then be used to undertake Shore &amp; Harbour works as required.</li> <li>East Lothian Foodbank – Red box project</li> <li>The foodbank has asked for £522.52 to help with sanitary deprivation. This is to help school pupils who are having financial difficulties to be able to access sanitary products. This will help with youngsters who have to miss school or activities as they cannot afford the products. The Area Partnership approved this funding.</li> <li>C. Stenton Community – Broadband</li> <li>On behalf of Stenton Community Association, CB have been investigating the feasibility of getting a better Broadband service. Stenton telephone exchange is the oldest sort using only copper wires. This means internet is very slow (typically about 2-5 Mbs – typically not enough for video or business applications). Stenton is geographically out with BT upgrade plans, so it is up to this community to sort itself out and fund any upgrade.</li> <li>They have now obtained a cost from OpenReach to run a superfast fibre cable to Stenton Exchange and install what's called a DSLM box by the telephone exchange. This then uses existing copper wire links to peoples' houses. It has the benefit of delivery about a 10-fold increase in speed for end users – up to a max of around 80Mbs for the Stenton Village and users a couple of kilometres away.</li> <li>If they succeed with this upgrade, it also means it becomes possible to extend a superfast cable from Stenton Exchange to other users not included in this current plan in future. It is therefore an absolutely key initial building</li></ul></li></ul>	

The total cost of the OpenReach upgrade will be £17,464.         BT have a Literacy grant for our Primary School which we have had authorised in principle which will cover 75% of the upgrade cost (amounting to £13,098) leaving just £4366 for the community to find as the 'Gap' payment         The Area Partnership approved this payment. <b>d. West Barns Village Hall – path</b> OW thanked the Area Partnership for all the funding it had supplied but wondered if they would see their way to allocating £3965 for the upgrade of the path in front of the hall. This path was a dirt path but it is now a slab path. The hall had the funding for the path but have had bad news from within the hall where the floor is having to be replaced at considerable cost. There were positive comments from members who had used the hall saying it was a great improvement and less chance of slipping. It was agreed for the funding to be allocated. PS thanked OW for all her hard work. <b>9. Budgets and existing allocations</b> Miixer – SGu gave the Area Partnership an update on the project. At the moment the group use a premises in Spott Road which they have out grown but on the 20 <sup>th</sup> October they move to the unit next to the TOFS at the rear of the backlands.
