Decision from HALAP Children & Young People subgroup for noting Adoption UK was asked to consider three changes to their previous application that was considered at the sub group meeting in January and were asked to address these before submitting their application again. These 3 points were subsequently addressed and the application was then referred to ELC Education Service for guidance. The advised received was that the following conditions must be met:-					
		 Confirmation from each School Head that they are supportive of this project Confirmation that the project is in each school's Improvement Plan and working time agreement. The sub group noted this and agreed to ring fence the money £13,900.00 until 31st October 2018 to give Adoption UK time to meet these conditions. The Partnership noted the Sub Groups decision.

8	Any Other Business	a. Haddington Community Shelter consultation The consultation for the shelter closed on the 30 th April with 129 responses and 219 comments received. All the information was collated and circulated round the members of the original subgroup. A meeting has been arranged on 8 th June 2018 to discuss how to take this project forward. Many people thought that the shelter was a good idea but not in the location at Mill Wynd. From comments received the feeling is that the shelter could be sited at skate park in Whittinghame Drive. DB was not keen on this idea. SG advised DB that no decision had been taken to site the shelter at the skate park. The proposed location for the shelter would be discussed at the forthcoming meeting. This was also reiterated by CM. PS explained that the youth shelter is in the Area Plan and the Children and Young Peoples subgroup fully support the Shelters. There was a discussion about the rubbish being left at the skate park area and how this could be addressed within the wider community. BE stated that he lived in the vicinity of St Martins, and would not object to the shelter but more education needed to be done in regards to litter and the effects it can have when left lying about. He asked if anyone knew the groups so they could be approached. SG stated that DH could be asked whether youth worker Michelle Mitchell could assist with this matter.	SG/DH
