



The Clubhouse offers bar and catering facilities, serving drinks and food in a lounge, dining room and spike bar. Breakfast and lunch is served Monday to Thursday with dinners also available Friday to Sunday.

Our social functions are infrequent at the moment but we hope to build up to 2 or 3 a month. These will be birthdays, retirements, funeral gatherings. Maximum 40-60 guests depending on government restrictions/availability.

We expect to provide recorded background music on a daily basis in the dining room. We expect to provide Live performances & dance facilities monthly for up to 60 people. We expect to provide televised sport daily, depending on schedules. The main sport is golf. We also show football and rugby matches when appropriate and expect up to 20 viewers at one time.

We provide outdoor sport every day!

We intend to provide outdoor drinking facilities on the North West facing side of the clubhouse, overlooking the course and sea. These will be used on a daily basis for refreshment before and after a round of golf and for social drinking.

By ensuring the maximum number of attendees is adhered to and that all necessary risk assessments are in place alongside the regular testing of appliances and safety systems. By ensuring staff are appropriately trained and encouraging patrons to be seated when drinking. By providing a duty of care as per licensing board guidance.

As a members' club, the staff know who the majority of customers are. Visitors and guests are signed in and out. Bar staff will monitor alcohol intake and noise levels. By clearly indicating when it is time for last orders and when serving is going to cease. By employing a handyperson to check for litter on a regular basis and by the provision of recycling facilities.

Protecting and Improving Public Health:

By promoting sensible and responsible drinking and having taxi numbers to hand. By making customers aware of the size of measures available and the alcoholic strength of beers and wines. By having non alcoholic lager on sale and by having bar snacks available outwith kitchen opening times. By having defib equipment available in the clubhouse.

Protecting Children and Young Persons From Harm:

The numbers of children visiting the club are low. Children who are not members but be accompanied by an adult. Children are not allowed within 1.5m of the bar. Providing sturdy plastic glasses on request. A children's menu is available.

I can confirm that the applicant and premises have been visited in relation to this variation application. My observations are as follows:

The changes applied for are:

- To change commencement of core hours on a daily basis to 10.00 to allow members and guests to partake of an alcoholic drink along with a full breakfast.
- To change commencement of off-sales hours on a Sunday from 12:20 to 10:00.
- To remove seasonal changes to operating hours between October and March each year.
- To add conference facilities and bar meals to the Operating Plan.
- To adjust the opening hour of the premises to 07:00 instead of 07:30 each day.
- To add in an outdoor drinking facility outside the lounge. This area faces north west towards the sea and is well away from neighbouring properties.
- To add in a bar and drinking area at the 10th hole for use on competition days.
- To make changes to question 6 of the Operating Plan to allow access to the premises by child members 6 years of age and above.

In summary, the proposed changes are supported by Licensing Standards with the following observations and suggested conditions:

- 1. The capacity of the outdoor area should be shown in the breakdown of capacity detailed in the Operating Plan at question 7.
- 2. The outdoor area should be covered by CCTV, maintained and to a standard, acceptable to Police Scotland.
- 3. There should be no music or amplified entertainment in the outdoor drinking areas to prevent unnecessary noise nuisance and disturbance.

- 4. When music and entertainment is in progress in the bar/lounge the doors leading to the adjacent outdoor drinking area must be kept closed to prevent noise breakout.
- 5. The outside areas should be closed by 22.00 hours each day.
