

I can confirm that the applicant and premises have been visited in relation to this variation application. My observations are as follows:

The change applied for is:

• To add in a 5×20 metre external drinking area on the west side of the club overlooking the rugby pitches. The area would accommodate up to 30 persons.

In summary, the proposed changes are supported by Licensing Standards with the following observations and suggested conditions:

- 1. The applicant has not requested that the outdoor seating area be used before the commencement of core hours at 11.00. It might be a consideration that club members might want to use this area to observe matches that start earlier therefore question 5(d) of the Operating Plan could be amended to show use outwith core hours. Licensing Standards has no objection to such an amendment if the applicant wishes the facility.
- 2. The capacity of the outdoor area should be shown in the breakdown capacity detailed in the Operation Plan at question 7.
- 3. The outdoor area should be covered by CCTV, maintained and to a standard, acceptable to Police Scotland.
- 4. There should be no music or amplified entertainment in the outdoor drinking area to protect neighbouring residents from unnecessary noise nuisance and disturbance.
- 5. When music and entertainment is in progress in the adjacent bar/lounge the doors leading to the outdoor drinking area must be kept closed to prevent noise breakout.

6. The outside area should be closed by 20.00 hours each day except to permit the viewing of a league match or competition that is actually in progress, and in any case no later than 22.00 hours.

Dear Kirsty

The elderly residents who reside at the Harkness Crescent houses that are adjacent to the club house boundary hedge are very concerned about the current alcohol licensing application and extension proposed for further outdoor seating at the club.

Firstly will the seating be to the east of the clubhouse (the preferred area that is furthest away from Harkness Crescent) or at the rear of the clubhouse towards the playing field?

If it is the latter then the residents are extremely worried by the proposal. They already have to endure noise and loud voices after midnight or later when the club closes and people walk from the rear of the club and out of the playing field area walking past the Harkness Crescent's bedrooms. Yes all the bedrooms are on that side of the houses.

It is not the extra seating that they are upset about but the placing of the outdoor seating and the closing times. Any extra footfall beside Harkness Crescent houses will aggregate the already regular disturbances that the elderly and frail residents had to endure before lockdown and now expect to endure again.

The outdoor seating is a good idea for many reasons but please will you take into account the following recommendations;

- 1) Please do not allow any outside seating near the Harkness Crescent vicinity.
- 2) As part of considering this application could you please insist that the clubhouse lock the hedge gate opposite the Harkness Crescent houses (and therefore their bedrooms) in the evenings when the bar is open?
