Purpose of Area Partnerships

- Area Partnerships have been established as the local voice of community planning in East Lothian
- Area Partnerships strengthen links between communities, area-based services and East Lothian Partnership.

 They provide a way for local communities to contribute to the outcomes in the East Lothian Plan and influence service planning and delivery in their area.



The East Lothian Partnership:

- Is responsible for community planning in East Lothian
- Brings together senior representatives from the public, community, third and private sector
- 3 Themes
 - Prosperous
 - Community Minded
 - o Fair
 - Has worked with partners and communities to develop a collective vision for East Lothian - the East Lothian Plan



Children and Youth Network

- Support from Start and Children and Youth Network merged to enable better coordination of provision for early years through to 18 years
- Coordinated Summer Activities working in partnership with Scottish Government Funding
- Worked together on provision for families over Festive Period led by Pennypit Trust
- Extended holiday/lunch clubs to one in each locality
- Looked to address ASB through joined up approach and addressing gaps/partnership delivery
- Work to support schools through PLAC, POPS,
 Individual support and group work
- Looked to provide parenting support classes



Sustainable PSG

- Funding confirmed for Preston Tower Primary School active travel project
- Fa'side, Musselburgh and PSG active travel representatives to identify ways to better support planning and transport teams in ELC decision making around connecting new and existing communities
- Cycling Scotland funding:
 - free cycle training available to PSG Connected Communities teams enabling delivery of cycling activities for all ages
 - Prestonpans Health Centre staff provided ebike introduction sessions, enabling them to use a loaned ebike for home visits
- AP funding: delivered cycling sessions for patients referred by GPs in Prestonpans to support health and wellbeing

Heritage Connections (Salt of the Earth)

- Community Heritage Funding Round Two June 2021 = 11 projects (£20,521)
- Community Heritage Funding Round Three May 2022 = 9 projects (£24,000)
- Number of films made and titles = 9 films made of local history accessible through Salt of the Earth
- Heritage Network Established
- For One Day Heritage August 2020, 750 people involved and over 1000 posts.
- SOTE sub group will become a heritage sub group under the area partnership consisting of heritage groups and community members to drive forward the heritage outcomes set out in the area plan.
- The project will culminate with a number of events to celebrate the local history and heritage in the PSG area.
