Work to date – phase 1

- All garden walls repaired and repointed
- Garden wall partially rebuilt
- Doocot roof repaired with new timbers and reslated
- Doocot walls repaired and repointed
- Nesting boxes inside repaired

- New accessible path in garden leading to doocot
- New interpretation seating area
- Information boards to explain the story of the tower with historical illustrations of how the tower may have looked at different periods
- Gardens reopen in June

Next Steps – phase 2

- Scaffold to be erected around the tower (without touching it!)
- Hoarding around scaffold with information boards
- Detailed stonework repairs on the tower walls inside and out
- New ornamental gate in garden wall by doocot
- Refurbishment of existing gates and metalwork on tower
- Architectural Lighting
- CCTV and new heritage style lamp posts
- Further historical work

The Future of the Tower

- Preparing a new Guardianship Agreement partnership including the community
- Encouraging visitors as part of a revamped and marketed heritage of the town
- Town trail for those unfamiliar with the town's heritage
- Voluntary opportunities to show people around and to be able to access the tower
