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6. Applications	
	HS thanked everyone who had sent in their scores for the applications. She explained the running order for taking applications would be based on Members pre-scoring, and used as a mechanism for viewing, discussing and then voting. If the last application of the evening is approved in full, any funding coming to the Partnership for 2025-2026 will be prioritised for it. What funds are left at the end of the evening will have no bearing on decision making.
	HS also confirmed that North Berwick Youth Project and Haddington Bridge Centre have deferred their applications until next financial year
	 North Berwick Youth Project – Friday Night Drop In – Free Sports - £2,632 – Deferred until 2025-2026 financial year
	 Haddington Bridge Centre – Motorcycle Project £7,324.39 – – Deferred until 2025-2026 financial year
	Members agreed that neither application needed to be scored or commented on a second time. The applications would be accepted and discussed at the next funding meeting.
	HS advised her conflict of interest regarding the application to create a small grant fund for the H&WA and asked DH to provide Members with relevant background information. DH stated that the need for a small grant fund had been identified whilst the H&WA had been working on its priorities for the forthcoming Area Plan. He spent time advising Members how priorities had been ascertained and then distilled into clear and concise objectives.
	Both DH/HS spent time explaining how small sums of money can make big differences particularly when it comes to H&W activities. It is hoped that the proposed surgeries to be delivered by VCEL will further support and compliment the small grant fund. DH advised that the initiative had already been launched that morning utilising £1,200 from existing HW&A finance. Following a discussion on scrutiny and audit procedures, Members voted as follows.
	 NBC AP HWA (Small Grant Fund) £2,000 Members voted: 17 YES 0 Against/Abstain 1 Conflict
	FN/MS/BW queried the process for taking applications and allocating funds. HS again advised as above, reassuring that if there wasn't enough funds for the last applications of the evening, that this should not interfere in the decision making process as funds would be allocated utilising the 2025/2026 budget.
	After a short presentation and Q & A session regarding the Public Access Defibrillator application, Members voted as follows.
	 Aberlady Community Association – Public Access Defibrillator 2025 – £1,880 Members voted: 15 YES 0 Against/Abstain 3 Conflict
	LF highlighted the importance of a catering size cooker to the village hall and its potential for generating income. It was acknowledged that the cost included 'works' as well as the cost of the cooker. Members voted as follows.

Aberlady Community Association – New Cooker - £3,754
 Members voted: 14 YES 0 Against/Abstain 1 Conflict

RG did a short presentation highlighting the value and importance of First Responders and the service that they provide to rural communities such as the Coastal ward. Members were supportive of the application but however felt the amount requested was considerable. It was suggested that 2 bags should be voted on, and then following a successful evaluation, a 3rd bag should then be considered.

HS advised all that the procedure for voting should be consistent throughout the evening and suggested that the vote should be taken for the full amount applied for in the first instance. Members voted as follows.

NBCA H&SCC – REAL FRIENDS - £12,500
 Members voted: 6 YES 7 Against 2 Abstain 1 Conflict

Discussion then took place regarding the opportunity to vote again for 2 bags only. Members agreed to vote on £9,500 for 2 bags and come back next financial year for 3^{rd} bag on receipt of a successful evaluation.

NBCA H&SCC – REAL FRIENDS - £9,500
 Members voted: 13 YES 0 Against 3 Abstain 1 Conflict

IM delivered a short presentation outlining the need for Interpretation Panels. He stated that there was a need to display new and relevant information. MS queried why the sum being requested this evening was less than the sum requested in the original application. IM explained how he'd approached a local crafts man to undertake the work and had received a better quote.

Aberlady Conservation & History Society – Aberlady Interpretation Panels
 New Figure £1,246
 Members voted: 18 YES 0 Against/Abstain 1 Conflict

OW presented some artists visuals and background information to the Kirk Ports initiative. OW provided detailed responses to all questions and concerns that were raised during Members scoring the application prior to the meeting. She acknowledged the high costs involved, and highlighted the way in which funds for the Scottish Sea Birds Centre had been raised in stages. She advised that North Berwick Trust were supportive of the proposal. She finished by advising Members that a lease was currently being pursued with ELC, but progress had been disappointing slow. She highlighted the importance of preserving the site now before it falls into further disrepair and is fenced off. After a short Q & A, Members voted as follows.

 North Berwick Environment & Heritage Trust – St Andrews Kirk Ports -£14,172

Members voted: 0 YES (Against votes weren't taken due to no YES votes being delivered) Against/Abstain 1 Conflict

Members discussed and agreed that a further vote should be taken with a view to allocating the remain £6,006 in the General Budget towards the Kirk Ports application. Members voted as follows.

 North Berwick Environment & Heritage Trust – St Andrews Kirk Ports -£6,006

Members voted: 3 YES 12 Against 1 Abstain 1 Conflict

	HS asked Members if they were happy to vote on £3,000 going to the REAL FRIENDS project for a 3 rd bag, highlighting that the application could then be funded in full from this years budget. Members agreed.					
	 NBCA H&SCC – REAL FRIENDS – (Remaining) £3,000 Members voted: 13 YES 0 Against 1 Abstain 1 Conflict 					
	HS declared stated that the remaining £3,006 in the General Budget should be utilised by the Children and Youth Networks Bursary Scheme, as had been the case in previous years when funds remained. AH and JM said that they would appreciate seeing the evaluations from funds allocated to the scheme in previous years.
