1 PURPOSE OF REPORT

3 BACKGROUND

- 3.1 The Public Bodies (Joint Working) (Scotland) Act 2014 requires Integration Joint Boards to issue directions to their constituent Local Authority and Health Board in relation to the functions and budgets delegated to them. Statutory Guidance published in 2020, supports this process.
- 3.2 Directions are the legal mechanism by which the IJB informs the Health Board and Local Authority what is to be delivered using the integrated budget and for the IJB to improve the quality and sustainability of care, as outlined in its strategic commissioning plan. They are an important aspect of governance, providing a means by which responsibilities are made clear and evidenced.
- 3.3 Directions are binding and the Council is required to comply by law with all directions received from the IJB.

- 3.4 Annually, the IJB approves and issues directions to East Lothian Council and NHS Lothian. Like previous years, the 2025/26 Directions include core directions which meets the statutory requirement for all IJB delegated functions be covered by a direction and specific directions.
- 3.5 The IJB may choose to issue further directions throughout the year.
- 3.6 The 2025/26 Directions are being lodged in the Members' Library to ensure Members are aware of the content and requirements of the Directions.
