The applicant is Natascia Pacitti who is a currently a personal licence holder. Application has been made for 3 occasional licences for La Trattoria as follows:

OCC601/25 - 11<sup>th</sup> September -24<sup>th</sup> September, on sales and off sales

OCC602/25 – 25<sup>th</sup> September – 8<sup>th</sup> October, on sales and off sales

OCC603/25 – 9th October – 22nd October, on sales and off sales

Currently, a provisional premises licence is held for the above premises that was granted in April 2025. The licence holder is Paola Crolla, the applicant Natascia Pacitti is the business operator.

As per section 45 (3) of the Act - A premises licence issued in respect of any such premises does not take effect unless and until it is confirmed by the Licensing Board which issued it in accordance with section 46.

For the premises to operate and make sales of alcohol there requires to be a valid occasional licence. The Board has previously granted occasional licences since March 2025.

On 27<sup>th</sup> August 2025 the last occasional licence ended and no further occasional licences had been granted.

On 18<sup>th</sup> August application was received for 4 occasional licences, through Ms Pacitti's solicitor Mr Macdonald, however as the date of commencement of the first occasional licence on 28<sup>th</sup> August did not allow for statutory reporting timescales it was rejected. Mr Macdonald was informed of this by the Licensing Team and guided that no alcohol sales should take place over the unlicensed period until the other applications could be determined. He acknowledged this and detailed his client had been made aware.

On Monday 8<sup>th</sup> September, I called Natasica Pacitti on the phone to check that sales of alcohol had ceased. She responded that alcohol was still on sale and had not stopped. She had incorrectly assumed that she had an occasional licence. I informed her that all sales of alcohol that had been made from 28<sup>th</sup> August onwards had been unlicensed. She detailed that her solicitor had not told her that there was no licence and to stop selling alcohol. I explained, it was her responsibility to ensure that the premises was licensed, and that she had the occasional licence on the premises before making any sales of alcohol. She

seemed very unfamiliar with the licensing requirements, what an occasional licence was and the status of the provisional licence. I asked that all sales of alcohol cease immediately to which she agreed.

I later spoke with Mr Macdonald who confirmed he had informed his client that alcohol sales had ceased by email.

I explained to Ms Pacitti that the offence of the unlicensed sales of alcohol would be reported to police which I completed that day, and the information was passed to Sgt Stuart Miller.

Ms Pacitti's lack of knowledge is concerning, and I would recommend she refreshes her knowledge or considers completing the personal licence holder course again to help her understanding of the licensing requirements.

I submit this for the Board's information in determining the occasional licence applications.

### Good morning Stuart,

Following a phone call with Natascia Pacitti this morning, I have established that there have been sales of alcohol from 28<sup>th</sup> August until today that have been unlicensed at La Trattoria, 119 High Street, Tranent. Occasional licence applications were made to start from 28<sup>th</sup> August onwards however the first application from 28<sup>th</sup> August – 10<sup>th</sup> September was rejected by the Licensing Board as there was insufficient time to process the application and allow for statutory reporting. Natascia Pacitti's solicitor was informed that this application would not be processed and that there would be a period where alcohol sales would need to cease. I have spoken to Mr Macdonald on the phone, and he confirmed that he passed this information on to his client by email. Natascia claims that she was unaware and wasn't told that she must stop alcohol. She confirmed that alcohol has been sold over the unlicensed period. I explained that it is her personal responsibility to ensure that there is an occasional licence in place and that she must have the licence at the premises before allowing the sale of alcohol. She is currently in Italy on holiday.

The next occasional licence application is for 11<sup>th</sup> September and has not yet been granted. I will now be submitting a report to the board on the outstanding occasional licences starting from 11<sup>th</sup> September and so they will be required to be heard for determination Board most likely 28<sup>th</sup> September. Therefore, the premises will remain unlicensed until then. I have asked that all sales of alcohol cease. The premises was highlighted at the weekly ELTACG meeting on 27<sup>th</sup> August to PI King as being unlicensed from 28<sup>th</sup> August, however I am unaware if any checks were carried out.

Please take this email as a report of a Section 1 Licensing (Scotland) Act 2005 offence.
